



Pakistan Tells U.N. of Acts of War by India

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) — Pakistan accused India Tuesday of armed intervention in its territory.

Taking the floor in the General Assembly, Pakistan's delegation head,

Mahmud Ali, said the situation along the border had gone beyond border skirmishes.

"It is armed intervention by one country, a member of the United Nations, In-

dia, in the territory of another member of the United Nations, Pakistan," he said.

"India has been engaged for the past few months and is engaged now in a clandestine war on Pakistan.

"It has concentrated a large number of its forces, some 200,000, and its machines of destruction on the borders of East and

West Pakistan," Ali charged.

"It has been shelling and mortar-firing East Pakistan incessantly. It regularly sends its own armed personnel into my country causing death and destruction. It harbors, trains, finances, equips and encourages — sometimes even forces — the dissidents to undertake acts of sabotage and cripple the economy of East Pakistan."
